Who was successful?

The September 2014 Individuals Fund round attracted 56 applications. Of these applications, 11 (20%) were successful.

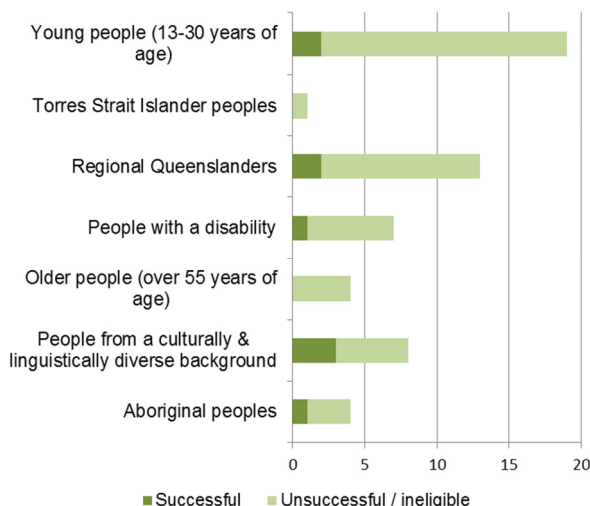
Visual arts, craft and design (30%) and music (23%) were the art forms with the highest number of applications.

Visual arts, craft and design had the highest number of successful applicants (5*), followed by music (3), theatre (1), dance (1) and writing (1).

Who applied?

More than half (6) of the 11 successful applicants described their career stage as emerging and 34% of all applicants identified as a young person.

Applicants could identify one or more of the following groups. For example, someone could identify as a young person and a regional Queenslander.



How much?

\$406 143 was requested from the Individuals Fund by 56 applicants. \$59 523 was invested in 11 Individuals.

The average request for funding from all applicants was \$7253. The average amount awarded to successful applicants was \$5411. 34% of applicants requested the maximum funding amount of \$10,000.

Successful applicants received an average of 84% of their initial funding request.
